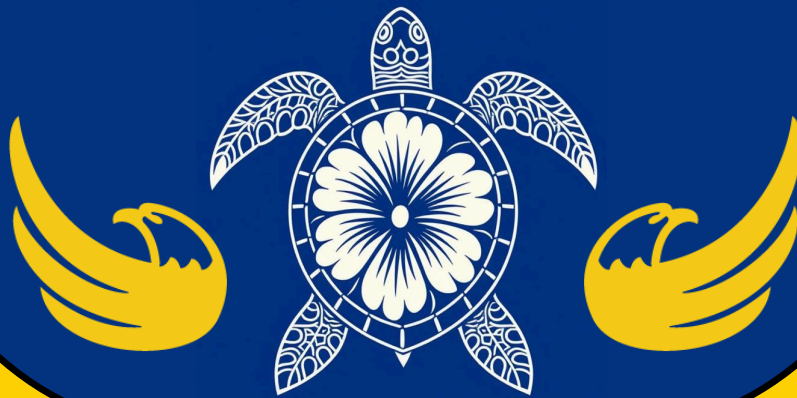
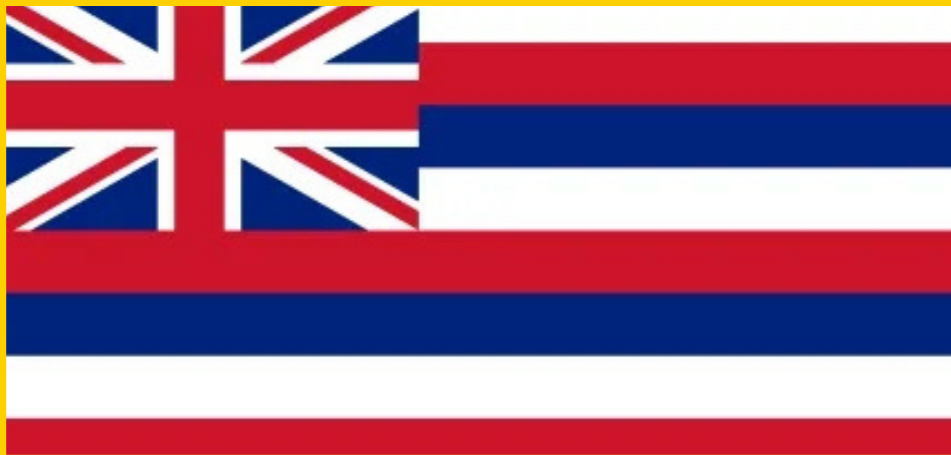




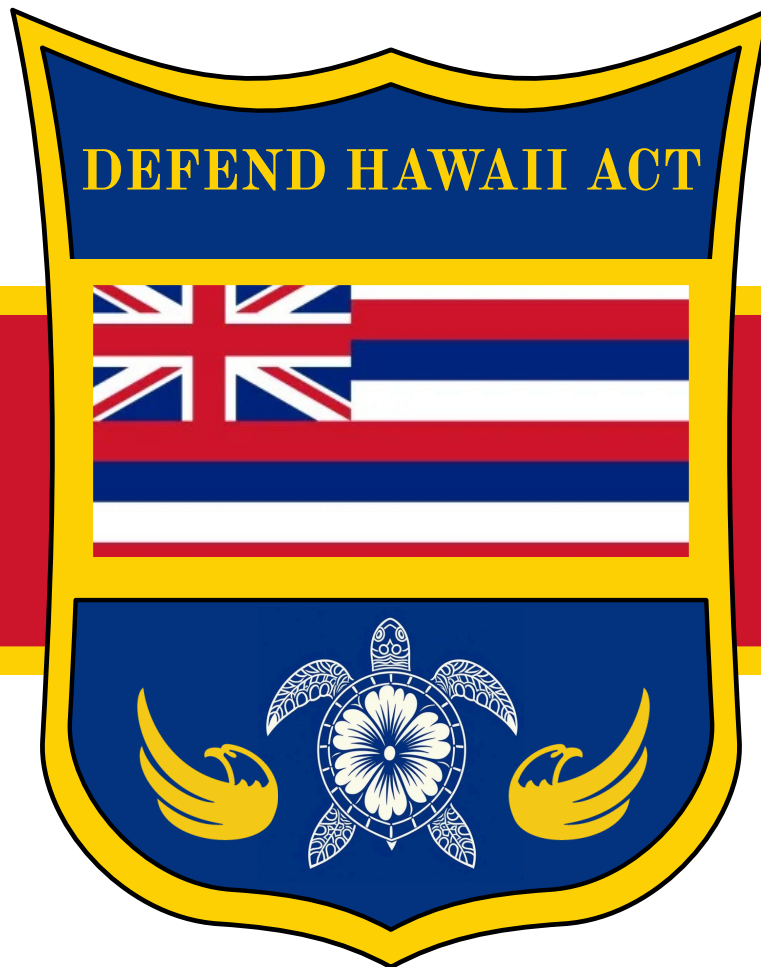

Introduction



Overview

Welcome!

The Defend Hawaii Act is a proposed bill to protect Hawaii's sovereignty over its National Guard members. The act prevents Guardsmen from being deployed into active duty combat without proper constitutional authorization or the Governor's consent.

The Defend Hawaii Act reaffirms the State of Hawaii's authority under the U.S. Constitution to maintain control over its militia, as outlined in Article I, Section 8, Clause 16, and the Tenth Amendment. By requiring clear federal authorization or gubernatorial approval for federal deployments, the Act safeguards Hawaii's National Guard members from being used in missions that lack proper justification, especially those involving active combat or unconstitutional federal orders.

This activism packet is designed to help concerned citizens, community leaders, and organizations advocate for the passage of the Defend Hawaii Act in the Hawaii State Legislature. It provides key information, talking points, and resources to raise awareness and encourage lawmakers to support this critical legislation.

The Defend Hawaii Act:

Affirms State Authority: The Act reinforces Hawaii's constitutional right to control its National Guard, ensuring deployments align with state law and the U.S. Constitution.

Restricts Unauthorized Deployments: The Hawaii National Guard cannot be deployed into active duty combat unless:

1. The U.S. Congress declares war, or
2. Congress explicitly authorizes the Guard's use to repel invasions, suppress insurrections, or execute constitutional laws.

Requires Gubernatorial Consent: No federal deployment (in-state or out-of-state) under Title 10 or Title 32 of the U.S. Code can occur without the Governor's written consent, following consultation with the Hawaii State Legislature.

Legislative Oversight: The Legislature can review all federal deployment requests and recommend approval or disapproval, ensuring transparency and accountability.

Protects Guard Members: The Act prevents Hawaii National Guard members from being sent into combat or hazardous missions without clear justification, prioritizing their safety and rights.

DEFEND HAWAII ACT

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII

NATIONAL GUARD

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Act is to affirm the State of Hawaii's constitutional authority over its National Guard as an important part of the militia, pursuant to Article I, Section 8, Clause 16, and the Tenth Amendment of the United States Constitution. Recognizing the original intent of the framers to reserve to the states control over their militias, this Act ensures that the Hawaii National Guard is deployed only in accordance with state law and the consent of the Governor, except where explicitly authorized by the U.S. Congress under its constitutional powers, and for the purpose of requiring the Governor to withhold or withdraw approval of the transfer of this State's National Guard to federal control in the absence of an explicit authorization adopted by the Federal Government in pursuance of the powers delegated to the Federal Government in Article I, Section 8, Clause 15 of the U.S. Constitution.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

(a) "Hawaii National Guard" means the organized militia of the State of Hawaii, including the Army National Guard and Air National Guard, as established under Chapter 121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

(b) “Federal deployment” means any activation of the Hawaii National Guard under Title 10 or Title 32 of the United States Code, including in-state or out-of-state missions which are executed by or under federal authority.

(c) “Constitutional authorization” means a declaration of war by the U.S. Congress or an explicit act of Congress pursuant to Article I, Section 8, Clause 15, to call forth the militia to execute the laws of the Union, suppress insurrections, or repel invasions.

(d) “Active duty combat” means performing the following services in the active federal military service of the United States:

1. Participation in an armed conflict;
2. Performance of a hazardous service relating to an armed conflict in a foreign state; or
3. Performance of a duty through an instrumentality of war

(e) “Official declaration of war” means an official declaration of war made by the United States Congress pursuant to Article I, § 8, Clause 11 of the United States Constitution.

SECTION 3. RESTRICTIONS

The Governor shall not release from this state into active duty combat, any member of the Hawaii National Guard unless the United States Congress has passed an Official Declaration of War or has explicitly called forth the Hawaii National Guard for any of the following three enumerated purposes in pursuance of Article I, Section 8, Clause 15 of the Constitution for the United States:

A military invasion of the United States, or

An insurrection, or

A calling forth of the Guard by the federal government in a manner provided for by Congress to execute the Laws of the Union, provided that said Laws were made in pursuance of the delegated powers in the Constitution of the United States.

SECTION 4. GUBERNATORIAL CONSENT REQUIRED FOR FEDERAL DEPLOYMENT

(a) No unit or member of the Hawaii National Guard shall be deployed for federal service, whether in-state or out-of-state, under Title 10 or Title 32 of the United States Code, unless:

1. The U.S. Federal Government provides constitutional authorization; or
2. The Governor of Hawaii provides express written consent, following consultation with the Hawaii State Legislature.

(b) For in-state deployments under Title 32, including missions related to law enforcement, civil disturbance, or disaster response, the Governor's consent shall be required, and such deployments shall comply with applicable state and federal law.

(c) Any federal order for deployment shall be subject to review by the Hawaii State Legislature, which may enact a resolution directing the Governor to withhold or withdraw Guard units from such deployment.

(d) Nothing in this Act limits or prohibits the governor from consenting to the deployment of any Hawaii National Guard member on Title 32, U.S.C., defense support for civil authority missions within the United States and United States territories or for active federal duty for purposes of training outside the United States.

SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT

(a) The governor shall submit a report to the standing committees of the legislature with specified subject matter jurisdiction over military affairs, as provided under Chapter 121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that summarizes his or her review of every order that placed or places the national guard on federal active duty and any action he or she takes in response to that review, within 30 days after his or her review is complete.

(b) The Hawaii State Legislature shall have the authority to review any federal deployment of the Hawaii National Guard, whether in-state or out-of-state, to ensure compliance with this Act and the U.S. Constitution.

(c) Upon receipt of a federal request for deployment, the Governor shall notify the Legislature within 48 hours, or as soon as practicable, providing details of the mission and any proposed consent. The Legislature may, by majority vote, recommend approval or disapproval of the deployment.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE, ENFORCEMENT, & SEVERABILITY

(a) This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

(b) The Governor, Adjutant General, and Attorney General of Hawaii shall take all necessary actions to enforce this Act, including legal challenges to federal orders that violate its provisions.

(c) If any provision of this Act is held invalid, the remainder shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect.

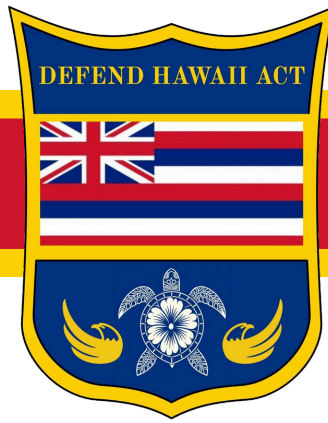
How To Help

Talking Points



5 Key Benefits

1. Protecting Hawaii's Sovereignty: This Act ensures that control stays where the Founders intended—with the states.

"The Act upholds the state's constitutional authority over its National Guard, preventing federal overreach."

2. Supporting Local Priorities: The Hawaii National Guard is vital for state missions like disaster response and civil support. The Act ensures the Guard remains available for Hawaii's needs.

"The Hawaii National Guard is critical for disaster response and local emergencies. This Act keeps our Guard available for Hawaii's needs."

3. Safeguarding Our Guard Members: By requiring clear authorization for deployments, the Act ensures that Hawaii's brave service members are not sent into harm's way without proper justification.

"Our Guard members deserve to know their deployments are lawful and justified. This Act prevents them from being sent into combat without clear authorization."

4. Ensuring Accountability: Legislative oversight and gubernatorial consent create checks and balances, ensuring deployments serve Hawaii's interests and comply with the U.S. Constitution.

"With legislative oversight and gubernatorial consent, the Act ensures decisions about our National Guard are transparent and accountable to Hawaii's people."

5. Preserving Constitutional Integrity: The Act aligns with the original intent of the U.S. Constitution, which reserves militia control to the states except in specific, congressionally authorized circumstances.

"The U.S. Constitution gives states authority over their militias. The Defend Hawaii Act enforces this principle, protecting our state's rights."

Common Questions



F.A.Q.

1. What if the President declares a “national emergency” and orders the Guard?

A: A presidential declaration alone is not a constitutional authorization. The Governor must withhold consent unless Congress declares war or explicitly calls forth the Guard.

2. How does the Legislature stop a deployment?

A: The Governor notifies the Legislature within 48 hours. They can pass a resolution directing the Governor to withhold or withdraw units. The Governor reports actions within 30 days.

3. What if the feds ignore the Act and deploy anyway?

A: The Governor, Adjutant General, and Attorney General are required to sue or legally challenge the order. Hawaii will defend the law in court.

4. Does this weaken national defense?

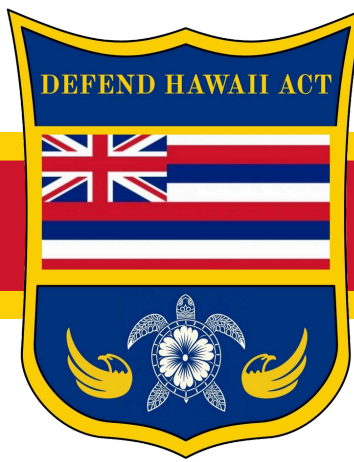
A: No. It strictly enforces the Constitution’s rules—Congress must authorize combat call-ups. Prevents executive overreach, not lawful federal missions.

5. Key talking point for veterans?

A: “This is pro-soldier, not anti-military. No more endless wars without Congress voting. Our Guard serves Hawaii first, America when the Constitution says so.”

If asked, “**Will this pass?**” → “*It’s constitutional common sense. We need 25 House + 13 Senate votes—your voice makes the difference.*”

How to Find Your Legislators

1. Go to the Hawaii State **Legislature website** at capitol.hawaii.gov
2. Use the drop-down menu on the “**Legislature**” tab and select “[Find Your Legislator](#).” You can also find the link by using the “My Legislature” shortcut button on the homepage.
3. **Enter your street address** in the search box on the right. Addresses should appear as you type. Select the correct one. (Note: If your search returns “No results,” click on the map of the island the address is on and try again.)

Instead of typing in an address, you can also click the map to place a pin.
4. The map will zoom to your location and display the boundaries of the Senate and House districts the address is in. **To find your legislators, go to the box on the right. Click on “Senate Districts (1) >”** — You’ll be shown your senator, their contact information, and photograph. **Click on “House Districts (1) >”** — You’ll be shown your representative, their contact information, and photograph.
5. To find out more about your legislators, go back to the Legislature’s website, and use the “Legislature” tab’s drop-down menu and select either “[House](#)” or “[Senate](#).” You’ll find buttons for “[Representatives](#)” and “[Senators](#)” on the respective pages. Click on your legislator’s name to visit their webpage.
